Aloha Kākou!

This lesson plays a traditional song *Pua Carnation* by Charles King. There are no new chords in this lesson, but I'll introduce a different style of strumming.

Listen to Track 1 and notice how the rhythm of the strumming is slightly different from the strumming played in the first 2 lessons.
